Red Class

Red Class have been working hard towards their PLIMs in 'My Cognition'. Pupils are developing their exploration of their environment independently. We have also been learning concepts such as 'size'.



Yellow Class

Towards the end of last week Yellow Class waved goodbye to our class butterflies. After learning about butterfly habitats, we took them down to the sensory garden and released them into a flower patch. We loved watching them stretch their wings and flutter away. In our subsequent 'How My World Works' lessons we've begun investigating Autumn and the change of seasons. In 'My Creativity' we used a range of Autumnal colours to paint leaves onto a tree template using a variety of methods.

Orange Class

Our fun taking session went very well this week in Orange Class. Pupils are becoming familiar

with this activity. It is great to see them demonstrating understanding and tolerance now, given that when we first introduced the activity, they were showing signs of frustration each time they had to pass one of their favourite toys to a friend after playing with it.



Rainbow class have been working with musicians, Andy and Holly. We have listened to them play their bassoon and clarinet; we played instruments and we sang!



Ladybird Class

This week Ladybird Class have started engaging in activities related to Black History Month. They have put glue and coloured wool onto Kente prints. They have also been developing their hand and eye coordination by pouring cornflakes into a bowl or tracing over story related sounds. Ladybirds have been trying to understand how they feel by looking at the emotion flash cards and choosing the one they think they experience at the moment. The children have also taken turns to demonstrate an egg splat activity after they have been shown how to.

Dragonfly Class

Dragonfly children this week explored blue slime and guided the activity by making requests and comments using their communication methods. They also chose their favourite sensory items to explore and share with their peers during their "My Communication" lessons.

Pupils went for a scavenger walk around the school area to find various materials linking to the story we are doing in class. Butterfly Class

This week in Butterfly Class the children have been celebrating Black History Month through different activities. We have explored creating Kente patterns with paint and making Adinkra patterns in flour, with chalk and playdough.

Our physical development sessions have been really successful with the children working well in different positions and using their equipment.



Bumblebee Class

This week Bumblebee Class made 'Volcano's in a cup' in a "Science experiment" with vinegar, food colouring, washing up liquid & bicarbonate of soda. We also enjoyed making Blueberry & Banana Muffins.



Gold Class

This week, pupils in Gold Class practiced on writing words and focused on handwriting. Pupils used templates to trace over the sounds they have learnt. Pupils can recognize different sounds and select the ones they need from magnetic letters sequenced them to write different symbols into words



Silver Class

This week Silver Class children are working on making art for Black History Month. We have selected few prints from Kente art design in Ghana to represent it. Pupils will be using the prints as a model and they will be applying glue and coloured wool to draw the symbols, with support. This will help them learn about the world around them and the use of fine motor skills like eye hand coordination.

Pads, Pampers, diapers, nappies

Children are eligible for a continence assessment and may be eligible for products from the age of 5yrs. In some cases where the child is a wheelchair user or unable to weight bear, this may be from 4yrs.
